Litigation and Dispute Resolution

Duane Morris represents healthcare clients in all forms of litigation arising out of construction projects, including protests, claims for changed or unforeseen conditions such as delays, disruptions, loss of productivity, acceleration, payment disputes, property damage, insurance coverage and allegations of defective design or construction. Whenever possible, we seek to achieve an early and fair resolution of construction disputes through alternative dispute resolution.

Contract Formation and Performance

Contract Formation and Performance

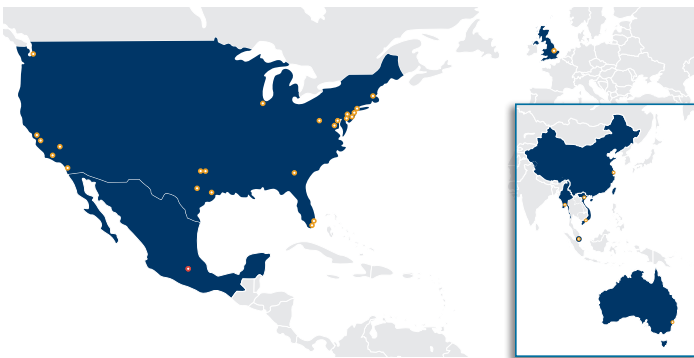
